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
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2024 Deutschesfest Map

For adults, from the times 11 a.m. to 1 a.m. the Biergarten is open but after the street fair at 5 p.m. minors are no longer allowed in.

History of Deutschesfest

Fifty-three years ago a group of individuals came together and brought to life their heritage of German-Russian descendants. Starting in 1971 Deutschesfest came to life, starting small and now being the biggest and most well-known festival in the Odessa area. It wasn't always easy and had hardships but never stopped. Founders came together to celebrate food, music, and other activities.


Friday, September 17th, 1971, was the first day of this celebration, starting it was hard but took off quick by that Saturday all booths were sold out and ran out of beer. Ever since that weekend, Odessa hasn't looked back and ends with sold out booths. There is beer for

days, games and activities to play your heart out. Odessa comes together to share their heritage, based off of the Deutschesfest website 80% of Odessa's residents are from German-Russian descent.

As the festival started growing, the town was staying the same size causing conflict on space for the festival itself. The founding fathers of Deutschesfest got inspiration from the famous Leavenworth and the Bavarian style craftsmanship. It was a struggle in the beginning to influence other building owners in Odessa to accommodate to the Bavarian style; it took a while for the town to accept the idea and not only that freeing up the space.

The Biergarten ran out of beer around 10 p.m. which according to the 1972 Biergarten Chairman Jim Walter was told with these guys that's a "no-no" so he sent out people with enough cash to stock pile beer all the way to Moses Lake and Ritzville.

As more people from all around came to celebrate the rich history of Odessa, Odessa expanded. Adding tents for the events and opening up more businesses. Preparing for Deutschesfest the community center would convert to the Biergarten for more open space, now it's the Biergarten year around and celebrated every day.



German recipe to try at home

Borscht Soup

Borscht, or borscht soup has been a staple in Eastern European cuisine for centuries. Historians note the recipe was originally made with hogweed, a plant that blisters the skin if touched with bare hands, but like stinging nettles, is rendered harmless when cooked.

When cultivated vegetables were more readily available, beets became the predominate base. There are two camps when it comes to borscht, red beet based and beet top/beef based, with hundreds of variations in each. Common to Germans from Russia who settled the Odessa area is a beef based soup with numerous variations. Following is a close adaptation of the borscht served at Deutschesfest in the past, by the Odessa Baptist Church Women.

Borscht Soup

- 2 to 2 1/2 quarts water
- 1 large meaty beef soup bone
- 1 tsp salt
- 1 medium potato, diced small
- 1 cup grated carrot
- 1/2 cup tender green dill, chopped
- 1/4 cup uncooked rice
- 1 cup, finely diced onion
- 6 large beet tops, chopped
- 1 tsp salt and 1/2 tsp ground black pepper

In a large kettle, brown soup bone on all sides. Add 2 quarts of the water and the 1 teaspoon salt. Slowly bring to a boil over medium heat and simmer for 2 to 3 hours, or until meat falls from the bone. Remove meat and bones from the broth and let cool until you can handle. Finely dice the meat.

Skim any fat from the remaining broth. Add meat, rice, onion, potato, carrot and dill. Cook slowly over medium heat until rice is cooked and vegetables are tender. Add the remaining 1/2 quart water. Season with remaining salt and pepper and continue to cook until hot.

Borscht is often served with toasted rye bread or crusty dinner rolls, or hearty sandwiches. A Rueben or a kraut ranza are perfect for dipping in this broth based soup.

Some borscht recipes include a tablespoon or two of vinegar or pickle juice for a bit of a sour flavor. Swiss chard leaves can be substituted for the beet leaves, Chopped cabbage, parsnips or turnips may be included.



Red beet borscht included the beet root. Most recipes start with beef broth. Cabbage is often included in the red beet versions. Some recipes include chopped apples and vinegar or sour salt for a slightly tangy flavor. A few recipes include tomatoes.

Borscht began as a way of making something to eat from what was on hand, evolving into distinct recipes in each ethnic region. Some cultures include borscht in celebratory meals. In other regions it is a harvest or butchering time soup. No matter the occasion, this savory soup is often the star of the meal.
